Hi

I write with regard to your consultation on the proposed 2300 new homes in Aireborough.

My opinion is that whoever has decided that this area can take 2300 new homes has never lived here, the road and rail infrastructure is already stretched to the limit in peak hours. Trains from Guiseley between 7 and 9 am are standing room only if you can get on the train, Getting onto the A65 and travelling at a speed that enables you to arrive anywhere within an acceptable time is near on impossible. The congestion on the A65 then leads to rat runs, my elderly parents live on Hawthorn Avenue in Yeadon and traffic travels up and down this often single lane residential road at high speed during peak times this in turn leads to my parent unable to go out as they are in fear of their lives.

What used to be Green Lane Mill in Yeadon has now been derelict for a number of years and is an eyesore, development would certainly enhance this site yet this has been dragging on for years, if people are desperate for houses this situation should not arise.

We have a number of green belt areas around these parts which in the whole divide the towns and maintain their identity yet you seem determined to fill in these areas with housing and therefore merging all the towns into one, under no circumstances should housing be built on greenbelt land.
