Dear Leeds City Council,

I wish to object to the proposed housing plans for Aireborough in the following sites HG2-12, HG2-41, HG3-2, HG3-3 & HG3-4.

I'm really worried that the special landscape & conservation area will be lost basically because of greed & selfishness from the developers. This is very unfair on our future generations to have this greenbelt land taken from them. I believe the government say Greenbelt can only be built on in extreme circumstances, which is not the case now as there are still lots of available brown belt sites available in Leeds. The developers want to build on Greenbelt sites for profit, I suspect the builds will not be for affordable homes but houses worth four to seven hundred thousand pounds which is out of the price range of most first time buyers.

The A65 is constantly gridlocked so I can't imagine how it will cope with all the extra houses, with one, two or even three cars per household. Also there has been no mention of additional facilities such as health centres & schools. What right has anyone to take away this land from local wildlife for the sake of profit, where will the bats, deer, foxes and birds live once their homes have been taken from them. Also what about woodland and ancient trees, why destroy these because of greed.

I would not have known about these proposed developments had it not been for the local action groups. The council has been terrible in informing local residents of their plans. I thought it was policy to engage with the local community not leave us on the dark.

Will this proposed land be able to cope, has anyone thought about flooding. I suppose once these houses have been built & sold the developers won't care as they have already made their profits & pleased the shareholders.

I understand there is a housing shortage & building new homes have to go ahead but why choose greenbelt land. Greenbelt land is supported by the government so why go against them.
