Thank you all for the information regarding discussion about this site. Have been online but could not find a link to allow me to comment on the possible proposal.

Whilst being aware as you state that there are no specific plans at this time I would like to express my views at this stage.

Whilst accepting that every ward must take its share of new housing, I cannot think that this particular site is eminently suitable.

First I assume that we are speaking of low cost housing?

Second to add additional traffic to that particular area not only from the building of houses but the addition of a school seems little short of lunacy! The traffic problems created by the Grammar School at Leeds traffic particularly from 8.00am onwards are widespread, creating bottle necks

on Harrogate Road heading North, on Wigton Lane travelling West, High Ash Drive

as vehicles are unable to exit High Ash Drive due to long traffic queues along

Wigton Lane, Alwoodley Lane heading East to turn left to go straight ahead or turn

right towards Leeds. I can only foresee additional problems and traffic hazard

as well as a probable increase in traffic attempting to 'rat run' by going

towards

King Lane into an extremely narrow road with quite a high usage.

You don't say whether the school would be Primary or Secondary. I would assume Primary. There is quite a lot of land attached to Wigton Moor Primary School which with though could allow extension of the buildings by linking

them which should provide extra school places .

Perhaps the area could accommodate a smaller number of houses without the addition of a school? - this would at least reduce the increased traffic to some degree.

If low cost housing is proposed what leisure facilities would be available at this site?
