As a passionate Rawdon resident, I am compelled to voice my objections to the Council's proposals to develop the following greenbelt land:-

Refs:- HG2-10, HG2-11, HG2-12, HG2-41, HG3-2, HG3-3, HG4-4,

The above sites are not justified as they depend too heavily on Green Belt, which will conflict with national policy as well as Leeds Core Strategy, where exceptional circumstances are required to build on our greenfields. The fundamental aim of Green Belt policy is to prevent urban sprawl by keeping land permanently open. These proposals will obviously fail to comply with national policy.

Chapter 11 of the sustainable development section of the NPPF states:

109; The planning system should contribute to and enhance the natural and local environment by:

- Protecting and enhancing valued landscapes
- Recognising the wider benefits of ecosystem services
- Minimising impacts on biodiversity

These proposed developments will have a enormous negative affect on local roads, schools, medical facilities, parks, transport and wildlife. There are far too many inconsistencies that suggest that these proposals are legally compliant with the NPPF. Let us keep the beautiful surroundings safe for now and future generations.
