HG2-12 (4254)

as they go against the national planning policy which states that our Greenbelt should be preserved to maintain our wildlife, the green spaces and individual communities.

There are many brownfield areas ready for development and there are many areas in North Leeds suitable for housing without encroaching on our protected Greenbelt.

There can be no doubt in anyone's mind that Horsforth has more than filled its new housing quota by the enormous housing estate the Council have allowed to be built on the old Sandos site and far beyond. This estate will put massive pressure on the already congested roads e.g. Horsforth ring road and Rawdon road etc. and the existing schools and amenities.

I live on West End Close, Horsforth, a cul-de-sac off West End Rise. At peak times the volume of traffic is extremely high coming down the Rise (which is a quiet residential road) this is basically a 'rat run' for commuters coming from Rawdon and Yeadon trying to avoid the queues of traffic on Rawdon road. I take my 5 year old granddaughter to school regularly and find it difficult and dangerous to cross this road.

I have lived in Horsforth for over 45 years and love the area. The Greenbelt that you are proposing to build on is what separates Horsforth from neighbouring 'villages' this would cause one large urban sprawl. Taking away our wonderful views, our fields where we love to pick strawberries and the places we love to walk.
