I object to these plans on the grounds that: to build on the on the green belt contravene the national planning policy framework (NPPF).

The developments will have an adverse effect on wildlife habitat and open green space: development of luxury housing on (desirable) green field sites does nothing to combat the housing crisis and damages the environment for future generation through destruction of the countryside . Brown field sites should be developed with affordable housing to regenerate derelict sites and inner city areas. Profits of the developers to build luxury housing should not be put before the environment and community. In addition, these developments will increase traffic congestion within an already traffic congested area.
