Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to object to the plans to build 155 houses on site HG2-10 (1221) Gill Lane Yeadon, for the reasons as follows in no particular order.

This land as far as I am aware has been greenbelt for many years and close to if not part of a conservation area. It has many mature trees that I know are a habitat to bat's, woodpeckers and owls, which I often hear throughout the night. This is also part of a continuous greenbelt between Leeds and Bradford currently preventing urban sprawl.

The A65 has been under traffic strain since the last development in the area some years ago where I believe over 2,000 homes were built. I note that the developer's traffic survey was carried out during school half term! I can only assume this was in order to try and convince the inspector that there is room for more vehicles, as had the survey been carried out at any other time it would have clearly shown how during peak times it already standing traffic queues making journey times very long. There are very few large employers in the area and no plans to bring in more, meaning many of the residents of any new homes on this site will need to use the A65 to travel to and from work therefore creating more congestion.

The infrastructure in the area is already straining at breaking point including, schools, doctor's, and dentist's.
