I wish to raise my concerns and voice my objections to the proposed sites (references listed below):

These sites are all currently greenfield/greenbelt sites. The proposal to build on these sites is not consistent with the national and local strategy to maintain a green infrastructure for current and future generations so that urbanisation and conurbations do not just merge into one and the population no longer have any areas they can go for recreation, exercise and just plain fresh air.

This is not just important for the sites mentioned above but also for other greenfield/greenbelt sites across the city where proposals are on the table to build.

I understand the need for new housing and I have no objection to building taking place on brownfield sites. It would be even better if the empty and boarded up houses, that are strewn across the city, were renovated and once again used for giving people much needed homes.

Additionally, the urgent need is for affordable housing and experience shows that large developments, built on green sites, are more often than not, predominately filled with executive homes e.g. the development on the Otley Road at Adel. This type of housing is not the priority shortfall in the housing stock.

I would appreciate your comments and reasons behind the proposals to drastically reduce our city's green areas, which actually make it a very pleasant city to live in, rather than develop other empty, derelict areas and also the reasoning behind the numbers, which seem extraordinarily high.
