Dear Sir/Madam

As a resident of Horsforth, I write to state my objection to the proposed development of green field sites in this area. The development of so many green field sites will lead to the complete loss of the villages of Horsforth and Rawdon, which will be merged into one great continuation of Leeds. I understand this would be inconsistent with both the NPPF and Leeds Core Strategy, so why propose to do this? The Green Belts should be kept to preserve the separate identities of Horsforth and Rawdon.

We have suffered horrendous traffic jams for many years on the A65 at Horsforth roundabout, and have finally got a sensible solution with traffic light being installed, and you now wish to build 777 houses on the green field site HG2-41, thus increasing traffic in that area by at least 1000 cars per day. That figure does not even take into account the additional proposed sites on that road i.e HG2-12, HG3-2, HG3-3, HG3-4 and HG2-43, a total of another 582 houses which would add around another 1000 cars onto that road per day, resulting in traffic jams once again!

I have no objection to the use of brown field sites in the area, and a small number of small green field sites might be necessary in the future, but certainly not the huge developments you propose. It would seem that this plan to use green field sites has been calculated on outdated requirements anyway. I suggest you think again.
