Many years ago the tannery at meanwood was protected and the plans to demolish it and build houses over the area and the adjacent allotments was scrapped.

There were many good reasons for preventing this development, access to the park , rights of way, green space, wildlife etc.. etc..

The Yorkshire post ran an article (please search through archives to locate or I can find a copy if you have trouble finding it) inspired by my letter to them explaining that the area called the Hollies and the roads with the name Hollin in are all referenced in the famous book Lord of the rings written by Professor Tolkien who was resident in Leeds for a while. The tannery almost certainly influenced his vision of Mordor and the beautiful woods around and pleasant location, houses etc influenced his description of the Shire and ancient beauty once, according to his legend, inhabited by the Elves.
