I am writing to express my **objection** to the proposed developments HG2-41, HG2-42 and HG2-43.

These are greenbelt sites and including these in the Local Plan is **NOT** consistent with national policy.

There are several brownfield sites in the area that **SHOULD** be developed before greenbelt sites are even considered.

From attending local meetings I understand that the proposal to use this Strategic Green Infrastructure goes against the Leeds Core Strategy.

I live on Rawdon Road and these fields are very important to me and my family as they create a rural village feel to the community, provide great views across the countryside, encourage family and community activities such as strawberry and asparagus picking, provide walking and cycle routes to the canal and river and most importantly form a barrier to **mindless urbanisation**.

We have just had the new road works completed to the A65 and ring road and already there are serious delays due to congestion, even before the completion of the Redrow development. What will congestion be like if the proposed "mass" developments were permitted? **UNTHINKABLE**. Also, the planners must give consideration to the impact the proposed access routes to the airport will have on the community?

These proposals must and will be strongly resisted by the local community. Please do not permit these proposed changes to the planning regime.
