Re HG2-41

You need to know people object in the strongest terms. I don't have time to write a crafted letter as I work and am otherwise busy raising children.

You should not build on greenfield sites before brownfield as this is not justified. If you do our children's future and their children's futures are affected. They are told at school that green belt means that the land has protection from being built on. Do not be disingenuous and build on the green belt sites around Horsforth and Rawdon.

I thought or I have been told that you should be consistent with national policy. If you build on the green belt sites in advance of brownfield you will not be consistent and you will be unwise decision makers.

The proposal to use this Strategic Green Infrastructure goes against the Leeds Core Strategy. Why are you even wasting Local Government resources even thinking about it. You seem to be acting obviously erroneously here, I despair. If this is right, I'm a banana.
