Dear Sirs,

I wish to object to the proposals to include yet more Green Belt and farmland in proposals to allow building of expensive homes in an area of little employment. Too many fields and woods have already been lost under housing so that the area is losing its identity.

The largest area of employment is in Leeds where there exists large number of acres of brownfield sites on which there could be built a considerable number of low cost family homes for the lower paid employees that are vital to the running of Leeds. These sites are within walking distance of employment or at most a short bus journey, unlike the above sites that will only add to the congestion of roads such as the A65.

Leeds needs homes for all the flat dwellers that become couples then families. Low cost, low maintenance, energy efficient homes to restore communities back into those areas immediately surrounding the city centre.

The proposals are not consistent with national policy, goes against the Leeds Core Strategy and cannot be justified.
