Sirs

I wish you to register my objection as firmly as is possible to the planned development at the above site for the following reasons:

There are no visible plans to improve the area's infrastructure to cope with the increased population who will inhabit the new housing and, as far as I am aware, no impact assessment has been carried out to ascertain how the proposed changes would consequently affect the people of Aireborough.

- local schools are at capacity - my family has recently had to go to appeal to get our children into their local primary school;
- dentists' and doctors' surgeries are at full capacity;
- traffic congestion already makes life stressful and tedious; I notice that the developers' traffic survey was carried out during school half-term when those of us who use the local roads know that congestion is much less noticeable at this time - this is disingenuous to say the least.

There are urban, brown-field sites that could be used much less controversially.

There are listed buildings around the site perimeter although the Council only mention one in their documentation.

The territory in question should really be part of the adjacent Conservation Area, according to Historic England.

The urbanisation of the remaining rural Greenbelt should not be regarded as inevitable.
