Dear Sirs,

As part of the Leeds Site Allocation Plan public consultation process, I would like to formally object to the proposed development of the following sites:

HG2-12

HG2-41

HG2 – 43

HG2 -42

HG3-2,3 and 4

I have read that the proposed development sites are NOT consistent with the national policy, specifically with regard to Green Belt. Leeds must continue to protect our Green Belt and greenfields.

The fields and open green spaces, which are being proposed for development, are important to me because they form a lung for the area – refreshing the air and adding valuable nature to the urban environment.

These sites should continue to be part of Leeds' 'Strategic Green Infrastructure' as identified in the Adopted Core Strategy.

It is my understanding that the proposed development sites are NOT consistent with the national policy, specifically with regard to infrastructure. It seems to me that Leeds Council is agreeable for housing to be developed without provision for shops, schools, medical centres and so on, let alone the major impact on the number of vehicles on the road. (Horsforth roundabout has not been improved by the recent changes for example – New Road Side from Rawdon through to Kirkstall Road is still a major bottleneck).

My concerns include a belief that brownfield sites are not being used before greenfield – nature will suffer and areas for exercise and relaxation will be destroyed. This is not justified.

Please keep me informed of the public examinations, submission of the plans and potential outcome of the review as I would like to retain my right to attend and speak.
