Dear Sirs,

I am writing to most strongly object to the proposed site allocation plans for development on GREENBELT land in Rawdon, Horsforth and Guiseley. The proposed areas, i.e. HG2-12, HG2-41, HG3-2, HG3-3, HG3-4 would merge Horsforth and Rawdon and this is totally inconsistent with Leeds Core Strategy, not to mention the National Planning Policy Framework.

I understand that the need for new houses has been reduced to 45,000 from the original 70,000 so surely this should remove the need to use any GREENBELT land.

New, affordable, housing should surely be built on brown field sites, where the infrastructure is already in place for both transport and public amenities. Further building on the A65 will cause major traffic problems as already being experienced on a daily basis.

GREENBELT is essential to the well being of our communities, enabling enjoyment of leisure activities, sport, nature, wildlife etc. To allow this development would turn Aireborough into an urban sprawl with no distinguishing features between the once proud villages.

There have already been nearly 3,400 houses built in Aireborough during the last 15 years with no additional facilities. We just CANNOT accept any more.

I strongly request that you consider our objections and spend some time visiting the sites in question.
