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I wish to respond to the Leeds Site Allocation Plans.

I wish to strongly object to plan HG2-41 (4240 ) To build on the green belt contravene the national planning policy framework. The A65 is already gridlocked for three hours per day, and cannot take any more traffic. It would mean urban sprawl between Horsforth and Rawdon.

I wish to strongly object to plan HG2-42. These fields have been open for domestic animals and wildlife since the 1950 ( when there was a plan to build a hotel there ) .

I wish to strongly object to plan HG3-2, HG3-3, HG3-4 . This would continue the urban sprawl between Rawdon and Horsforth . It would also make the A65 impossible unless it was a four lane highway ,completely out of the question.

I wish to strongly object to HG2-12. These fields have been part of the green corridor between Leeds, Horsforth, Rawdon, and up the Aire Valley since time immortal , and should be maintained.

I do not object to HG2-43 . That is if the only development is on the footprint of the old college buildings, and not on the land surrounding it.

There are plenty of places in Horsforth and Leeds, which are brownfield sites that could be built on , I'm all in favour of that . They could easily build a couple of thousand between the viaduct and the flyover on Kirkstall Road. But we all know what the Developers prefer.
