I am writing to object to the plans to destroy the green belt land in Yeadon and surrounding areas.

I object on the grounds that this is not a sustainable approach to addressing the lack of housing stock in the city. Building on local green belt reduces the quality of life of residents. Not only this, but the proposals seek to destroy habitats and ecosystems for animals and wildlife.

The A65 is already permanently grid-locked. Having lived on Whack House Lane for over 30 years, I experience on a daily basis the unrelenting flow of nose-to-tail traffic. Transport links to both Leeds and Bradford from this area are poor and local services are at capacity. There are certainly better places to build homes in Leeds - notably the various brownfield sites.

Yeadon, Guiseley, Rawdon and Otley have seen many homes being built in recent years. It is clear that we will also have to deal with the unsustainable proposals for the airport link road. This, being despite the fact that a rail link would be an entirely more effective solution. Collectively, these proposals will impact on the character of the local area. Enough is Enough - Quality of life has to be protected and sustained.
