Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to register my objection to the inclusion of the Holy Trinity Glebe Field (Church Lane, LS6) in the Leeds Site Allocations Plan.

This field represents the last centrally-located green space in Meanwood. The field is enjoyed by many and whilst the public may not have access to it, its presence provides a small glimpse of countryside within built-up surroundings. I walk up and down Church Lane regularly and I never fail to appreciate that space: it is heartening view and as I gaze across over the traditional wall, across the meadow to the church is one that reminds me of Meanwood's roots as a village prior to being built up.

I do recognise that the council is under pressure to provide +60,000 homes across the city and I understand that everywhere should take their share. However, I also understand that there are developments planned within the grounds of Carr Manor, Meanwood Hall and the Working Mens' Club. The WMC area is a substantial space and I implore you to consider the possibility of increasing capacity there in order to avoid building on the Glebe field.

I understand homes are needed - this is important; but the wellbeing of the existing residents is important as well and the sight of green space is important to everyone. Please don't impoverish our community by giving developers the right to build on our last remaining centralised green space.
