With reference to the Site Allocations plan I wish to object to the housing plans relating to the 3 points below-

<!--[if !supportLists]-->1. <!--[endif]-->I wish to object to the proposal as a whole. The concept of allocating several sites spread over all of Leeds will prove ridiculously costly for Leeds City Council as each plan will have to go through Application/ Consultation/ Committee/ Appeal etc taking up a huge amount of money and man power not to mention the upset and distress for all of the residents affected. If Leeds City Council are to meet the housing targets then I suggest building a new village possibly on the East side of Leeds where there is less congestion near the A1 and A1M where there is a large amount of undeveloped land. A new village could incorporates all the necessary infrastructure and services required rather than trying to increase housing in already over populated areas that are unable to cope with more people/houses/ cars. The site allocations plans are fundamentally flawed in most areas due to the overcapacity of the road infrastructure in much of Leeds as a whole.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->2. <!--[endif]-->Objection to site 1124 on Access, increase in traffic, loss of trees and natural habitat, loss of Greenbelt.

I wish to object to any development in Calverley as the road infrastructure is unable to accommodate all the existing traffic. Increasing housing will put greater strain on an already over populated area. Calverley already suffers from Rat Runners through the Village and this will only increase by adding to the current number of houses in and around the area. Note that until Greengates traffic lights are improved very few people will attempt to use the new train station at Applerley Bridge because of the amount of time it takes to get through the traffic lights. In particular I wish to object to sites 1124 as this is currently farmland, the access is difficult and it will increase the amount of traffic. I feel it is essential to maintain an area of Greenbelt between Leeds and Bradford so both Cities have a clear identity. Note both Calverley Schools are oversubscribed and there is currently not enough places for children in the village therefore adding additional housing will increase the problem.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->3. <!--[endif]-->Objection to sites HG2-12 HG2-41 HG3-3 HG3-4 on Access, increase in traffic, loss of natural habitat, loss of trees.

I wish to object to the sites allocated above as again these plots will increase traffic in the area, in particular the A65 which is already overburdened and over congested with traffic during all times of the day. Access to the site would need to incorporate a traffic light system, this would add to the congestion on the A65. This increase in traffic will have a knock on effect to the surrounding roads, in particular the A657 through Calverley.

The local schools will be unable to accommodate pupils from this increase in housing.

These Plans form part of the Local Development Framework (Local Plan) for Leeds and have been prepared within the context of the Leeds Core Strategy (adopted November 2014). A key focus of these Plans is the allocation of land for Housing and Employment, to meet the targets agreed in the Core Strategy, as well as designations for Green space and Retail centres.

Aire Valley Leeds has the potential to deliver up to 7,800 new homes and 255 hectares of employment land to create thousands of new job opportunities as well as new community facilities and leisure and visitor attractions. These growth targets are set out in the Core Strategy.
