I am objecting to the planning applications in Rawdon on green belt land. The planning is based upon the natural boundary between Horsforth and Rawdon and the fact there has not been adequate research by Leeds council into the detriment of building houses on these sites in an already extremely bad area for traffic and the future health problems further carbon monoxide being pumped by standing cars into the atmosphere every day on the A65 would cause. There needs to be health studies carried out in these areas as you are taking away valuable green belt land and filling it with more cars to pollute the atmosphere.

I am also concerned about the natural drainage these fields absorb which means the water not running into the river Aire but being held back in the earth of these fields on such sloping land. Excess water flowing down off roads and houses into rain water gulleys in that area would put additional pressure on the river Aire which could cause further flooding downstream in the city centre of Leeds-this must be carefully be looked into.

Rawdon is a place of beauty and Leeds councils lack of foresight is apparent when putting forward these sites for future development.
