I writing to object to the three proposed housing sites in Bramhope

Site References

HG2 – 15 (3400) Green Acres And Equestrian Centre
HG2 – 16 (1002) Creskeld Lane, Bramhope –land to the rear of no. 45
HG2 – 17 (1080-3367A) Breary Lane East, Bramhope, LS16

The reasons for my objections are because

The A660 is the main route into and out of Leeds and it is already totally congested. To build all these additional houses, will only increase this congestion on a road that is already failing to cope with the scale of the current traffic.

There is not enough infrastructure in place (the school and doctors to name just 2) to deal with a development of site HG2 – 17 (1080-3367A) this size and accommodate the development you would need to use green belt land to create the infrastructure.

Brownfield sites of which there are plenty in Leeds should be reused before any green belt or green field sites are destroyed for housing development. There are no exceptional circumstances that apply to Bramhope that would allow the land to be taken out of green belt.

Bramhope is a lovely village and has historical land marks and listed buildings. It now lies within a conservation area. By increasing it's size by 25% will turn it from a village into a small town.

Bramhope falls within an Conservation Area the description of which states ' the majority of houses are individually plot built and have a very positive impact on Bramhope. Characterised by large front and back gardens with wide space between plots. Developing 23 houses on site HG2 – 16 (1002) would result in cramped houses in cramped plots the exact opposite to the Conservation Area it is supposedly in.

Building 42 houses on site HG2 – 15 (3400) that is accessed by a road that is only built for a single line of traffic as you cannot pass 2 cars side by side would cause massive congestion and make is dangerous for the children of Scouts and Brownie's who site is situated on that very road.

For all these reason I would ask that the planning application is rejected.

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
