I write to object to the Councils proposals to allow 505 houses to be built in Bramhope and in particular site references 3367A and 1080.

My reasons are as follows:

- The scale of development would completely change the character of Bramhope
- The A660 is currently massively overcrowded even at times outside of the rush hour and is not adequate to cope with such a large increase in traffic
- There will be a huge environmental impact caused by people commuting to Leeds, with the consequential impact on Leeds' carbon footprint, as there is little employment opportunity within an 8 mile radius and poor public transport
- The development would cause an unacceptable loss of green belt and lead to urban sprawl
- Light pollution
- There is ready availability of brown belt sites in the city centre which need to be tidied up and developed before reducing the already small green belt
- There are a large number of unoccupied houses within the city which should be addressed before building new houses

A site which is nearer to the urban built up area is site reference 2054. This site would cause less traffic impact, would not cause urban sprawl and has natural boundaries which would neatly complete the developed area,
