The houses being built still won't be within their price range anyway as its all about making as much money as possible. So they will have to rent and can't save to buy a house then. My daughter is on a zero hour contract after gaining a Spanish and English degree then a Masters in TEFL. She currently earns £11k per year but any job is better than no job and it's better than benefits however it makes saving for a deposit impossible.

No more schools, dentists, doctors.....

What about our wildlife, our hedgerows, our farm animals. It will also struggle whilst you destroy more green areas.

You are ruining the Aireborough area which I love for all the green we have around us but it seems sadly for not much longer. It has already diminished somewhat.
