HG2-12 I am writing to object to the development of site HG2-12, it is within our green belt and is a haven for wildlife, there are many footpaths and bridleways which are beautiful to walk on allowing you to enjoy the history and peace of this area. Houses here will destroy this , they will put more pressure on our roads and our public services, which are already over stretched and over crowded. This site borders the crematorium which should not be surrounded by noise and more traffic chaos but peace.

HG2-41 I am writing to object to the development of the strawberry fields for housing, our roads cannot cope with this many new houses and what this brings. It destroys arable land for growing food, it will destroy habitat for wildlife. It will put our public services and communities under more pressure. This site borders the crematorium which should not be surrounded by noise and more traffic chaos but peace.

HG3-2 I object to the development of this site, it is a green field site. There have historically been coal pits on this site, 2 on the 1890 map. This site is part of the boundary that separated Rawdon from Horsforth. Our roads and public services cannot cope with this development, it will destroy wildlife habitat

HG3-3 I object to the development of this site for housing, it is a greenfield site, making up our boundary between Rawdon and Horsforth, it will put more pressure on already over worked roads and public services, it will destroy wildlife habitat. This site borders the crematorium which should not be surrounded by noise and more traffic chaos but peace.

HG3-4 I object to the development of this site, it is greenfield land, part of our boundary between Horsforth and Rawdon, it will destroy wildlife habitat, there is the Leeds Country way close by this area, the Red Beck flows down hill here to the River Aire. There are historically coal pits and Sand pits in this area on the 1890 map. It will put more pressure on already over worked roads and public services.

Please listen to my worries about how these developments will affect my quality of life and destroy this area, putting immeasurable pressure on communities and Public Services.
