It's my understanding that these proposed sites aren't consistent with the national policy, specifically in regards to greenbelt. Leeds must carry on protecting our greenbelt and green fields for the future.

The open green spaces and fields being proposed are important to me because they are places of natural beauty that have a positive impact on the area and the people who live here. Keeping these places undeveloped gives people a space to enjoy and keep active. Animals such as deer and owls are among the resident here too and it would be such a shame to lose their natural habitats.

The A65 is already a huge bottle neck+even with the new traffic lights at Horsforth roundabout, it still takes an unbelievable 40 minutes to get from Rawdon cross roads to the roundabout at peak time. Extra traffic would certainly increase this time, aswell pollution in the area.

These sites should continue to be part of Leeds' strategic greenfield infrastructure for the future as identified in the adopted core strategy. It's also my understanding that the proposed sites do not fit with national policy in regards to infrastructure and without plans to improve our already overwhelmed doctors, dentists and schools, extra homes here would certainly have a detrimental affect on our health, wellbeing+education.
