Please treat this email as an objection to the proposed plans for new housing in Rawdon.

I regularly boast to friends at what a lovely place Rawdon is to live in... the friendly, village atmosphere, the community spirit and the lovely green space that feels like the countryside. This is a huge asset to Rawdon and to build here would not only take away this perception but also alter me, my family's and my neighbours way of life.

I have two young children and while schools are already brimming with happy pupils and teachers, any more strain could potentially change this. I do not want my children's education to be affected by oversubscribing. Pupils should go to school in the area they live... it's a simple formula, however, I fear that more housing would encourage more applications for good schools and potential over-subscription.

Traffic in Rawdon has been increasing steadily over the last while with airport traffic and this would only increase with more housing.

At present there are already pressures on local amenities and it wasn't long ago I had to wait 3 days for a doctors appointment. I believe there are no doctors surgeries planned to accompany the new housing and therefore this is another obvious concern.

Please take my points into consideration when making a decision and I trust you will make the right one for the people of Rawdon.
