As part of the Leeds Site Allocation Plan public consultation process, I would like to formally object to the proposed development of the following site:

HG2-10 (1221) Gill Lane

It is my understanding that the proposed development site is NOT consistent with the national policy, specifically with regard to Green Belt. Leeds must continue to protect our Green Belt and greenfields.

The fields and open green spaces, which are being proposed for development, are important to me because our house currently backs onto this site. We have a lovely view of green fields with horses, sheep and cows not to mention all the other wildlife that currently live on the site in the many trees. We would hate to see more houses from our back garden and not green beautiful fields. Our children are 6 and 4 and it would be so upsetting for them to just see concrete and lose the field. The road A65 cannot cope at the moment as it stands so adding more houses will only cause more traffic. Where will the children go to school? There is only one infant school and junior school in the area and they are already full. Dentists and doctor surgeries are full already. The site allocations plan is unsound because the council has not carried out a genuine comprehensive Green Belt review.
