As part of the consultation process I would like to formally object to the proposed development of the following sites:

HG3-2 HG3-3 HG3-4

Land adjacent to Knoll Lane & rear of Layton Lane Rawdon.

HG2-12

Woodlands Drive Rawdon.

HG2-42.

Broadway + Calverley Lane

HG2-41

South of A65 from Horsforth Roundabout to Rawdon Crematorium

HG2-43.

Horsforth Campus.

This is not consistent with the National Policy For the Preservation of Green Belt land in order to prevent the sprawl of large built up areas. The loss of these spaces will create a corridor of urbanization from Kirkstall, Horsforth, Rawdon, Heaton through to Guiseley, in the process these towns will lose their individuality and become a

a dormitory for Central Leeds. People need green, open spaces for relaxation, leisure pursuits and to keep in touch with the natural environment

More recent statistics based on the 2011 Census suggest that L.C.C.'s target of 70,000 new homes by 2028 is excessive and therefore there should be no need to use Green Belt land if recycling of derelict and other urban land were to be used.

The proposed number of houses to be built on the aforementioned sites would bring further traffic problems. Already there are concerns on the A65 which will only be exacerbated if more houses are built in the Aire Valley area. Schools, shops and other amenities are not provided on new developments, public transport services are poor and expensive resulting in more car usage, more pollution and will add to already severe traffic problems

We need to keep our valuable green spaces for the well being of people already living in the area
